One such tradition is beginning the season of Lent with the delicious donuts known as "Pączki". These treats, eaten on FAT TUESDAY (this year FEBRUARY 17), allow us to use up the "fat" ingredients in our homes before beginning the Lenten Season.

Under the direction of Brother Thomas (ASSOCIATES) and Jerry Heuler, our Paczki Kitchen begins with the Paczki PREP operation on SATURDAY, February 14 starting at 9 AM in Jericho Hall. There will be much to do: measure out ingredients, putting together boxes, attaching labels and tearing paper towels, and other assorted tasks!
