HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL

The Gospel for this second Sunday in Lent retells the story of the transfiguration of Jesus.

Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up the mountain to pray. While he was praying, his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory.

Jesus took Peter, James, and John along to witness His transfiguration. These three would become pillars in the newly established Church once Christ had ascended into heaven. Peter was the first pope -- the rock upon whom Christ built His Church. James would go on to become the first of the Apostles to be martyred. John would be the last of the Apostles to die. Each played a pivotal role.

Jesus allowed these 3 to see Him standing next to Moses, the great forefather who gave the Law to the Israelites, and Elijah, arguably the greatest of the Old Testament prophets. Before their eyes, Christ was transfigured and began to glow. Mind you, Christ was not transformed on the mountaintop; He was transfigured. He didn't change. He merely allowed His followers to see a glimpse of Himself as He truly was inside.

In Genesis we're told that we were all made in the image and likeness of God. Occasionally we see a glimpse of that image of God in another, often in the innocent eyes of a child, or of a mother comforting one of her little ones. Mostly, we live our lives surrounded by walls that we've put up to shelter ourselves from the world and from those who might hurt or embarrass us.

I got a call just tonight from a friend who was in seminary with me. He lamented the fact that he hates to watch the news because the world is filled with such tragedy and violence. I smiled and told him that there is still hope. After a recent funeral, I was heading back to the sacristy to change and a man walked by with his little girl at his side. Another person walked up to me and smiled. He pointed to the little girl and said, "That child is someone special."

I didn't know what to make of the comment. He went on to say "I watched her during the funeral. Her dad was choked up at the thought of his grandmother's passing. Without a word, his little daughter put her arm around her father's shoulder. For twenty minutes, I watched her rub her father's back and comfort him. What a special little child."

Sometimes in the midst of great sadness and pain, God allows us to see an act of such pure and innocent love that we are reminded that He is inside each of us. Once in a while, we open our hearts -- allowing others to catch a glimpse of His image and likeness that lies within us. This Lent, may we all become like that little child.
