AN EYE FOR AN EYE

Last Sunday's readings challenged us to look into our hearts and question if we have harmed others, even with our words. Matthew quotes Jesus, who said, "whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment"

This week, we hear the words of Jesus who not only warns us not to hurt others by word or deed, but He also calls us to forgive those who may have harmed us.

You shall not bear hatred for your brother or sister in your heart. Though you may have to reprove your fellow citizen, do not incur sin because of him. Take no revenge and cherish no grudge against any of your people. Lev. 19

The words Jesus chooses are interesting. He says that we may from time to time need to reprimand or correct others, but that we should not incur sin because of them.

How often does the devil see a golden opportunity to attack us when we are innocent victims? Satan isn't satisfied that he may have provoked someone to do us harm. He wants it to escalate by our retaliating and even escalating the conflict. You can almost imagine the conversation around the tent in ancient Israel: "He thinks he can get away with carelessly killing one of my goats? I'll show him! I will kill TEN of his sheep!!"

That phrase "do not incur sin because of them" sticks with me. It makes me realize that holding a grudge does no harm to the other person, and it certainly doesn't help make up for the wrong we suffered (real or imagined). All it does is make us bitter and more likely to take it out on the next person we encounter, even if it's a family member.

Clearing a parking spot of ankle-deep slush in front of my house this past week made me think back to the blizzard of 1993 when more than 23 inches of snow fell in 24 hours. I can still recall spending more than an hour shoveling a parking spot for my dad in front of the house. A little while later a young neighbor pulled his car into the spot. (I hate to admit what I wanted to do to the car). I trudged up the long hill to ask him to move his car. "Where else can I park. The whole street is buried in snow." he said. Biting my lip, I calmly said, "Take the time to shovel a spot in front of your own house. I spent an hour shoveling a spot for my dad who is almost 70."

Thankfully, it worked out okay. There were no Hatfield and McCoy grudges, but if the devil had his way, one or the other of us could have turned it into a huge argument instead of an opportunity to calmly address a disagreement.

It's *only* with the help of God that we can let go of grudges or calmly deal with conflict. In the end, even if I had to clear another spot, would it be worth creating an enemy for life? What bothers me is that I still recall the incident 20 years later. The roots of anger run deep, but the Grace of God is unending. As we approach Lent, let us pray particularly for those who find it hard to forgive.
