All in God's Time

This weekend we hear the Gospel story of Lazarus being raised from the dead. Those who came to know Jesus during His lifetime had to number in the thousands. Among these followers, Martha, Mary, and Lazarus stood out among the crowd.

The Bible contains a couple of stories of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. One passage relates the story of Mary sitting at the feet of Christ and listening to Him speak as Martha complained that Mary wasn't carrying her weight. The second story tells of Mary anointing the feet of Jesus with expensive oil as Judas complained that the money could have been used to feed the poor. The home of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus was apparently a place where Jesus could come and relax. That's why it seems odd that when Martha and Mary sent word to Jesus that Lazarus was gravely ill, Jesus waited TWO DAYS before responding. By the time He came to Bethany, Lazarus had already been dead 4 days.

John tells us that Jesus loved Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. As He arrived, Martha greeted Him, saying "*Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you.*" Jesus reassured Martha that her brother would rise. Martha nodded, saying she knew he would rise in the Resurrection on the last day. Jesus responded by saying:

"I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live."

As the story unfolds, Jesus asks them to show where Lazarus has been buried, and St. John relates His reaction in the shortest verse in the entire Bible. "*Jesus Wept*"

Why did Jesus weep when He knew He was going to raise Lazarus from the dead? Why did Lazarus have to die in the first place? Why did Martha and Mary have to go through the agony of mourning their brother? Why did Jesus wait **4 days** before returning to Bethany?

Why? Because it was all part of God's plan, and all according to God's time. Since Jesus waited 4 days, no one could claim that Lazarus was just 'unconscious' or in a coma. When Jesus wept, the reaction of those present was profound; even the Pharisees who disliked Him said, "See how He loved him." Jesus demonstrated to everyone who was present that He had power even over life and death. Many were converted that day by seeing the miracle. Even those who were later skeptics at the news of Christ's resurrection could not dispute the fact that He had power even over death.

So often we question God's timing. We wonder if He is listening to our prayers and when He will finally answer them. The story of Lazarus is a reminder that God does hear our prayers, His timing is always perfect, and even though we don't see it, He *always* has a plan. It's a reminder for us to "*Be still and know that I am God.*"

THE SHROUDING OF THE STATUES AND CRUCIFIXES IN THE SANCTUARY AND THE FRONT OF THE CHURCH will take place again this year at the Good Samaritan, beginning this week. This is an ancient custom in the life of the Church, beginning on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, that helps to remind us that we are entering the most sacred time of the liturgical year as we recall the death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The shrouding of the statues and crucifixes in purple cloth is meant to help us to avoid any distractions and focus on the Paschal Mystery. The shrouds remain in place until after the Good Friday services are completed, and we begin to decorate for Easter.

BLESSING OF EASTER FOOD



Holy Saturday was one of the busiest days of Holy Week. In addition to cleaning the house, the fragrant aromas of specially prepared meats, breads and pastries permeated the house. This made the strict fast and abstinence of the last day of Lent even more difficult.

One of the most solemn and ancient rituals observed by the people of Europe and the world over is the blessing of Easter foods. On Holy Saturday the family would prepare a basket of symbolic foods to be taken to church to be blessed, and eaten on Easter Sunday morning to celebrate this great feast of Jesus' Resurrection. Each basket was beautifully decorated and covered with an embroidered or crocheted cloth. A blessed candle was placed in the basket and lit during the ceremony as a sign of "Christ The Light Of The World."

TRADITIONAL BLESSING OF EASTER FOOD

CHRIST IS RISEN !! INDEED HE IS RISEN !!

The Traditional Basket for blessing should include:

COLORED EGGS: Brightly colored and decorated eggs, symbolic of Jesus' Resurrection from the tomb on Easter morning.

EASTER BREAD-PASKA: This rich, sweet, yeast bread is symbolic of Jesus Christ the Bread of Life. The bread is often ornamented with a cross of dough in the center surrounded by a circle of plaited dough symbolizing the crown of thorns or with eggs.

PASTRIES: Specially baked holiday and egg rich pastries filled with fruit and nuts symbolizing the many gifts from God and the sweetness of the Resurrection.

HAM AND SAUSAGE: These foods are symbolic of the abolishment of the "Old Law" and the establishment of the "New Law" in the Resurrection of Christ Jesus.

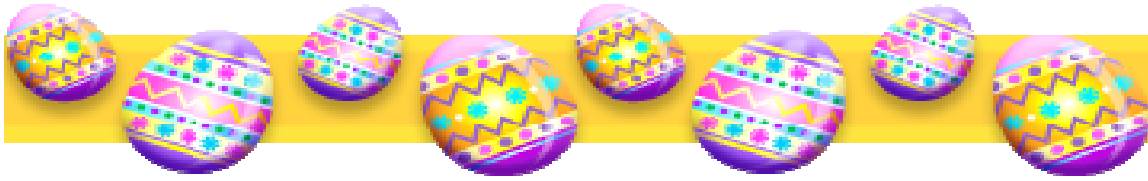
CHEESE: This rich egg-milk cheese is prepared and shaped into a ball and decorated with religious symbols with pepper corns or cloves. It is symbolic of the Christian moderation and sweetness of the Resurrection.

HORSERADISH: A combination of grated horseradish root and red beets. It was part of the Jewish Passover reminiscent of the bitterness of their life in Egypt. For Christians it represents the bitter sufferings of Our Lord's Passion.

BUTTER: This dairy product was fashioned into the shape of a lamb, representing the "AGNUS DEI", symbolic of the sweetness of the Lamb of God.

SALT: Salt is blessed because it is a fundamental seasoning and preservative. Traditionally It is symbolic of prosperity and justice. It symbolizes Christ who preserves us to eternal life.

Regional differences dictate various additions such as wine, vinegar, bacon and pepper. Usually all the delicious Easter foods eaten are prepared ahead of time; so that the festivity of the day will not be burdened with preparation and all may enjoy the feast !
