### From Father Joe

April 27, 2014 is an historic day in the life of the Catholic Church. This Divine Mercy Sunday marks the date of canonization of Pope John XXIII and Pope John Paul II, two beloved servants of the Church. While many fondly recall the pontificate of Pope John Paul II, I thought it appropriate to talk a little of Pope John XXIII for those who are too young to remember him.

Angelo Roncalli was an unlikely candidate for the papacy. Born into a poor Italian family with 13 children, he was ordained to the priesthood in 1904. He spent years in the service of the Church, acting as an ambassador between the Vatican and various countries. Most of his assignments were considered dead ends, but he was eventually named a cardinal in 1953. Five years later, upon the death of Pope Pius XII, the College of Cardinals could not decide upon a new pope. After 11 ballots, Cardinal Roncalli was finally elected pope, choosing the name John XXIII. At the age of 76, he was expected to be a "caretaker pope," living out his few remaining years without making many changes. Instead, he convened the Second Vatican Council, opening the doors for the laity to play a more active role in the life of the Church. Though he never lived to see the end of Vatican II, changes like celebration of the Mass in English and the commissioning of Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Eucharist were a result of his vision.

This humble pope came to be known by his beloved followers as *il Papa Buono* (the good Pope). When preparing for a visit from the wife of President John F. Kennedy, the pope diligently rehearsed his greeting in English, repeating "Mrs. Kennedy" and "Madame Kennedy." When she finally arrived, he spontaneously threw open his arms, calling out "Jacqueline!" Once when a poor woman reached up to touch him as he passed through the streets, he stopped and grasped her hand, telling her that there was no reason she shouldn't be able to get at least as close to him as the King of Jordan did.

Pope John XXIII became known throughout the world as a kind of beloved father figure. Angello Roncalli, died as he lived, a poor, humble servant of God, but not without touching the lives of millions of people, and allowing the laity to take an active role in serving God in the Church.

As we celebrate the canonization of Popes John Paul II and John XXIII this Divine Mercy Sunday, it is appropriate to recall the words that Saint Faustina was instructed to inscribe on the bottom of the Divine Mercy image:

### "Jesus, I Trust in You."

Cardinal Karol Wojtyła entrusted the Church to Jesus in Communist Poland and went on to become Pope John Paul II. Pope John XXIII entrusted the future of the Church to the Second Vatican Council. They are shining examples of what God can do through us if we trust in Him. Just as the Christians in the early days of the Church sold what they owned and pooled their resources to support one another, so we are called to entrust our lives to Christ... every day.
