From Father Joe

I recently caught part of a movie on television called "We Were Soldiers". The movie is based on the experiences of Lt. Colonel Hal Moore in the early days of the Vietnam War. Colonel Moore was in charge of the 7th Cavalry during the Battle of Ia Drang Valley. Unknowingly, his unit of 400 men were deployed near a camp of 4,000 enemy soldiers. At one point in the battle, a platoon of soldiers were cut off from the rest of their unit and reinforcements were unable to get to them. The men radioed for "Air Cover," requesting aircraft to ward off the attack of the enemy until reinforcements could rescue them. They spent the night hoping and praying that someone would come.

A devout Catholic, Moore retired as a General, and his driver wrote a biography entitled, "A General's Spiritual Journey." In an interview with Our Sunday Visitor 6 years ago, General Moore mentioned that he tried to make it to Mass every day.

On August 7, *Catholic News Service* reported that Pope Francis was asking Catholics around the world to pray for tens of thousands of Christians in northeastern Iraq who were forced from their homes in the middle of the night by Islamic State militants. The article goes on to say that fighters belonging to the Islamic State attacked towns and villages in Ninevah province overnight. According to the article, "The Christians, about 100,000, horrified and panicked, fled their villages and houses with nothing but the clothes on their backs."

The Vatican has appealed to the United Nations to intervene and end the violence and persecution. Last week, Bishop Zubik encouraged us all to pray for peace in Iraq and for the protection of those Catholics and other religious minorities who are being mercilessly persecuted.

Hearing the reports about Iraqi Christian men, women and children fleeing for their lives, I can't help but wonder how many are hiding and holding their breath, even as I write this article, hoping beyond hope that they will not be discovered and killed. I wonder how many children are praying that *someone*, somewhere knows of their plight and is praying for them. The picture in my mind of the terrified soldiers in Vietnam who were cut off from reinforcements comes to mind. Just as they prayed for "Air Cover", we need to continue to provide "Prayer Cover" for the children who are scared and running for their lives. Pray that Michael the Archangel and his troops will watch over our brothers and sisters, hiding them from the eyes of those who seek to do them harm.

It is easy to read a newspaper article and feel detached from those who are suffering — especially when they are half a world away. If we were the ones hiding among the rocks holding our breath for fear of being discovered, wouldn't we be hoping that someone out there was covering us in prayer? May God bless and protect them.
